

WHY IS ADDRESS NUMBERING IMPORTANT?

It can be a matter of life and death! Emergency personnel depend upon address numbering to locate victims. When seconds count, emergency personnel can lose precious moments when unable to determine a victim's location.

As stated in Article I, Section 14-2, "All houses and buildings located in the corporate limits of the city shall conspicuously display the number assigned to such house or building by the City Manager. Such numbers shall be displayed in a manner so that they shall be clearly visible to the public from a position on the nearest public thoroughfare to the building."

DID YOU KNOW?

- You must obtain a permit when installing a fence, pool, adding building additions or alterations (carports, etc), paving driveway extensions, erecting storage sheds, or remodeling.
- Ordinance No. 1999-06 States that you may not conduct more than three yard sales (I. E. garage sale, estate sale or similar sales), in a twelve month period and continuing for not more than two consecutive days. You must also obtain a permit.

**Yard sale signs are prohibited within the City right of ways.*

**IMPORTANT
ORDINANCES
FOR
HOMEOWNERS
TO KNOW**



The City of Hinesville is a member of the Clean Community Association of America and thus subscribes to the effort of keeping our city a clean and healthy place to live. The city spends a large amount of money each year in beautification of city property and in picking up dry trash and garbage. Each citizen needs to do his part in insuring that his individual parcels of property are well maintained.

Article I, Sec. 11-5 Prohibited Conditions:

This ordinance makes it unlawful for homeowners/tenants to allow garbage, trash, debris, weeds, vines, grass or other vegetation, whether cut or growing to accumulate on their property.

These conditions would likely become a breeding place for snakes, rodents, flies, gnats, mosquitoes or other harmful or dangerous creatures or insects, or be likely to cause personal injury or property damage by human illness or fire, or which may become a health hazard.

Please become familiar with the residential parking ordinance which addresses RVs, pavs, and commercial vehicles!

Article I, Section 14-4 states that all persons in charge of real estate are required to keep the area between the roadway or sidewalk and their property free from weeds, and properly mowed.

Stagnant water (Sec. 12-70). It is unlawful to allow a pond, pool, barrel, tin can, vehicle tire, or any container to collect and stagnate. In the event it is not practical to drain or fill such pond, the same must be effectually treated against mosquito breeding to the satisfaction of the health officer.

Section 13-8(4) states that it is unlawful for you to place or leave outside any building or dwelling, any dilapidated furniture, appliance, machinery, equipment,



building material, junked motor vehicles or other items which are either in a partially rusted, wrecked, junked, dismantled or inoperative condition, and which are not completely enclosed within a building or dwelling.



Interested in beginning a Home Occupation?

A permitted home occupation will be a home telephone service only. No customers will be allowed to come to the home for services.

You are not permitted to have a sign on your property to advertise a home-based business.

Home Daycare Centers have several restrictions. If you are considering opening a Home-based Daycare, you must check with City Hall by calling 876-3564.



City of Hinesville Article I, Section 4-5 makes it unlawful to keep or maintain animals in such manner to create an unsatisfactory or obnoxious condition, or to become noisy, offensive or a nuisance to the neighbors or citizens or to disturb the peace.
