COVID-19 Curfew Information for Hinesville as of 3.18.20

UPDATED APRIL 21, 2020: As of Tuesday, April 21, there is still no curfew in effect for the City of Hinesville. This is based on the Executive Order issued by Governor Kemp on April 3, 2020. The Order expires at 11:59 p.m. on Thursday, April 30.

UPDATED APRIL 3, 2020: The City of Hinesville renewed the emergency orders in relation to COVID-19 on Friday, April 3 in keeping with Governor Kemp's order. The Governor's Shelter-In-Place order begins at 6 p.m. on Friday, April 3 and ends on Monday, April 13 at 11:59 p.m.

Also keeping with the Governor's order, at this time, there is still NO CURFEW in effect.

HINESVILLE, Ga. (Mar. 18, 2020) – Please be aware that at this time there are NO CURFEWS in place for the City of Hinesville. We will continue to update this document every few days to keep the public informed of the status of curfews in Hinesville.

The COVID-19 situation is a very fluid one - with lots of new information coming in daily, sometimes hourly. As the situation changes, as it inevitably will, we will continue to share information via our social media pages, New Flash alerts and COVID-19 webpage.
